## Kipling Station Design Charrette...

The Kipling Station project to relocate the Mississauga buses from Islington to Kipling Stations has been approved with funding from the City of Toronto and the provincial government.

The "Inter-regional Hub" aspect will be owned and managed by GO Transit, while leaving TCC with the subway station itself.

On May 8, 2008, GO Transit sponsored a Design Charrette (a fancy word for workshop) to review and upgrade the design for the project after an independent design panel recommended design improvements of the Kipling site to make it a more attractive 'civic place' and offer more

convenient and comfortable pedestrian traffic routes among subway, bus and GO train riders.

In the full day Charrette, a large cadre of city planning staff, volunteer architects and local resident representatives offered a variety of design alternatives to respond to the panel's critique.

The suggested improvements would clearly enhance the site in many ways but would also cost more money. So GO Transit and/or the City will need to commit more funds to make them happen.

Stay tuned for how this evolves.

#### Power Down And Give Your PC A Rest

Keeping PCs on when not in use, even for a few hours, consumes a lot of unnecessary energy. Check to see if your operating system has a power saving "Sleep" mode that can automatically activate when your computer is inactive for a period of time. You could be reducing carbon dioxide

emissions by up to 25 kilograms per year. Assuming every one of our 548 suites here at The Essex hs a PC, we could collectively be saving around 10 tonnes in carbon emissions every year, not to mention the direct electricity \$\$\$\$ savings.

## **Planning For The Garbage Levy**

Plans are underway by the City of Toronto to impose a garbage levy on high rise residential buildings such as ours. Soon, possibly as early as July of this year, Essex 1 and Essex 2 will be have an additional charge added to our water bills to cover the number of bins of garbage we put out for collection. This charge could be as high as

\$25,000 per year for each building and push up future common elements fees. So it is really important that all residents continue to work hard to separate all the recyclables from our garbage. We will not be charged for legitimate materials we put in the recycle bins.

# **More Emphasis On Recycling Strategies**

The Essex boards believe it is important to put additional emphasis on developing strategies to increase our percentage of material that we put in our recycling bins versus what we throw away as garbage.

For Essex 1, the Site Quality Committee, chaired by Carol Goldman, will work on developing these strategies as part

of their existing mandate.

For Essex 2, Gary Mark Keiser and Bill McDougall will be the board chairs of their new Recycling/Garbage Committee.

Volunteers can call the management office to be part of the committees.

### **Gone With The Wind**

After a long snowy winter, the warmer weather is finally here! It will be great to enjoy our balconies in the summer months ahead.

Safety is the priority on balconies. Please remember that we are not allowed to hang or place any items from the balcony ceiling, walls, or railings. A strong wind can all-too-easily send unsecured items flying and hurt someone.

in the past.

There is a process in place to ensure they are working properly and generating the electricity savings we expect.

# The Essex 1 Copper Story is Complete

The repairs to the building hot water piping system have been completed successfully and ahead of schedule.

To minimize the probability of

experiencing new problems any time soon, more appropriate re-circulating pumps have been installed and the gauge of replacement copper now exceeds building code.
The work was guided by our consulting engineers and paid for by Tridel even though the failures were outside the two year warranty period.

# **Compact Fluorescents Are Getting Better**

Have you been reluctant to try the new fluorescent light bulbs you've been hearing so much about?

Maybe you've heard about how they contain mercury which can be dangerous, or maybe your past experiences with fluorescent lighting were unpleasant.

You might remember lights that flickered and gave an unhealthy glow to your complexion. Well, don't worry anymore!

Now commonly called CFL bulbs, you've already heard how they can save us lots of money because so they use so much less energy and last

much, much longer than the traditional bulbs (good for us and the planet).



They no longer flicker and you can buy them in "warm white" which gives off the light you are used to seeing in your home. More recent improvements also have them available in a wide variety of sizes and shapes.

Please use the new Essex 1 and Essex 2 CFL bulb disposal bin in each recycling room.

The province of Ontario does not consider CFL bulbs as hazardous, since the amount of mercury is so low. If you buy good quality bulbs (look for the Energy Star rating), the amount of mercury in them is even lower. The city does not want broken bulbs for recycling. If you should break one, sweep, do not vacuum the pieces and powder into a small plastic bag and dispose of it as regular garbage.
